

**Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) Reporting:  
Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students  
Mitchell College HEERF Student Portion Fund Report**

Overview:

Section 18004(e) of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act ("CARES Act" or the "Act"), Pub. L. No. 116-136, 134 Stat. 281 (March 27, 2020), directs institutions receiving funds under Section 18004 of the Act to submit (in a time and manner required by the Secretary) a report to the Secretary describing the use of funds distributed from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund ("HEERF").

On May 6, 2020, the U.S. Department of Education, Office of Postsecondary Education posted their reporting requirements for HEERF participating institutions.

Each HEERF participating institution is responsible for providing this information in report format (the "30-day Fund Report"). In addition, these participating institutions are required to post the information listed below on the institution's primary website. Accordingly, the following information will be easily accessible to the public and made available 30 days after the date when the institution received its allocation under 18004(a)(1) and upda\$308,264 for

emergency financial aid grants to eligible students, made possible by CRRSAA's Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF II).

On May 16, 2021, Mitchell College received notification that it was awarded \$911,172 for emergency financial aid grants to eligible students, made possible by ARP's Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF III).

Mitchell College (MC) hereby addresses questions related to HEERF Student funding:

1. An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the

CARES, CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

**MC Response:** CARES, CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) grants to students range from \$200 up to \$1,500, awarded based on students with the greatest documented need using Estimated Family Contribution (EFC) from the annual Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). This tiered approach to grant awards provides substantial award amounts to our neediest students as well as emergency grants to all Title IV eligible students who may be struggling as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.
